These features are meant to help students and parents begin or continue a dialog about secondary school choices.

Secondary School Application Timeline

The following steps should be completed within the months listed below. Individual schedules and steps may vary by school, but this provides a general reference.

In the Summer

Learn about prospective schools by spending time on secondary school websites. Formulate questions about the schools you might like.

September

Schedule tours and interviews for your list of prospective secondary schools. Your list should include at least three schools. Kent School has designated three days as excused absences for you to visit secondary schools - September 27, October 4, and October 11. In addition, October 7 is a School holiday and could be a good option for a campus visit.

Schedule a meeting with Nancy Mugele, parents and student, to discuss Secondary School options as needed.

Optional depending on the schools you are applying to:

Register for SSAT (https://ssat.org/) or ISEE (https://erblearn.org/families/isee-by-erb/). Select the schools' codes that should receive your schools. Include Kent School in that list. Our code is 4348. Students should be registered for the upper level test in December 2024. If you wish, you can register them for another upper level practice test in November.

October

To prepare for secondary school visits, students should schedule a 30-minute mock interview with Mrs. Cammerzell, Mrs. Cernak or Mrs. Mugele.

Attend the Secondary School Fair on Wednesday, October 9, 2024

Complete in-person or virtual secondary school visits.

November

Select the schools to which you will be applying and begin the application process. Students should apply to at least three schools making sure you have selected at least one school that you feel confident about your chances for acceptance.

Determine your timeline for completing all applications including supplemental essays. We think it is a good idea to have all applications complete and submitted by December 15. Make sure you are aware of individual school deadlines.

Submit all referral and recommendation forms to Kent School by November 30.

December

Complete and submit all applications.

While most independent school application deadlines are in early January, please avoid a last-minute scramble by completing yours before winter break, and by giving your teachers and advisors ample time to complete their letters of recommendation.

January

Early Decision Admissions (Gunston, and possibly other schools if you have a sibling attending) are mailed or emailed in mid-January.

March

Regular Admissions decisions are mailed or emailed in early March.

For Kent County High School STEM applicants, the process begins in March. Details will follow if you are interested.

Admissions Interview General Questions

These questions help an interviewer understand your personality and background.

- Tell me about your family.
- How would you describe yourself? (see below)
- What do you enjoy reading outside of school?
- Why are you interested in our school?
- What are you passionate about?
- What is your greatest strength and weakness?
- What subject do you enjoy the most and why?
- What subject do you like the least and why?
- What makes you unique?
- What extracurricular activities are you interested in?

How would you describe yourself?

- What would it be if you only had one word to describe yourself?
- What are three words you'd use to describe yourself?"
- How do other people describe you?
- In your opinion, what are your most important traits?
- What words come to mind when you think about yourself?
- What adjectives would you use to describe yourself?
- How would you describe your personality?
- Tell me about yourself.
- Describe yourself in one sentence.

Other Tips

Have a question ready for the School you are visiting. Research the School's website and develop a specific question about a program, class, leadership opportunity, or sport at the school you are visiting.

Please do not say to an Admissions officer at one school that another school is your first choice. You can honestly say that you are looking at a few schools and still learning about them.
